# REFLECTION for Twenty-Fifth Sunday (B)

In the gospel of today Jesus told his disciples that he was going to be killed and rise from the dead on the third day, but they failed to understand. Instead of thinking about what Jesus told them, they were discussing which of them was the greatest. But when Jesus asked them what they were discussing on the way, they were silent. They could not tell Jesus because they knew what they were discussing was shameful. Jesus was telling them about the most important part of his mission in this world; how he would be arrested and killed, but they were more concerned about positions of importance.

Whatever it is you cannot say to Jesus cannot be noble. St John Bosco was asked, "If you were told that Jesus was coming now, what would you do? He replied, "I will continue doing what I am doing." Can all our discussions or actions stand the test before Jesus?

Jesus used the opportunity to teach his disciples a lesson in humility and service. What matters in life is not the position one occupies, but the service one gives; and service comes from a humble and loving heart.

The story is told of an old monk who prayed for many years for a vision from God, but it never came. Just as he was about giving up, God answered his prayers. As he settled down to the vision, the monastery bell rang. This meant that it was time to feed the poor who came to the monastery door daily. The monks took it in turn to feed them daily and it was the old monk's turn. He was torn between continuing with the vision or abandoning it to go and feed the poor at the door. Reluctantly he got up and went out to feed the poor, thinking that the vision was over.

After over an hour of feeding the poor, he came back to the room and, to his greatest surprise, the heavenly vision was waiting for him. He went down on his knees in thanksgiving to God. A voice from the vision said to him, "My son, had you not gone off to feed the poor, I would not have stayed."

From this experience the old monk learnt a lesson, the best way to serve God is not in giving up material things; the best way to serve God is not necessarily to turn our backs on the world and go off to some monastery. The best way to serve God is not necessarily to spend hours in prayer or heavenly visions. The best way to serve God is to reach out in service to our brothers and sisters, especially the less privileged.

Jesus told his disciples, "Whoever wants to be first must place himself last of all and be the servant of all." At the end we shall be judged on how much we have served others, especially the poor. (Mt 25) St John of the Cross said, "In the twilight of life, we shall be judged on love." Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "Love is the answer." It is not so much about how much we have accomplished, but how much we have loved; how much love we have put into our deeds. Its all about love, humility, and service. This should be our motto. According to Albert Schweitzer, who abandoned his comfortable life in Europe to work as a missionary doctor to the poor in Africa, "...the only ones among you who will really be happy are those who sought and found how to serve;" "For it is in giving that we receive."
