REFLECTION for Twenty-Eighth Sunday (B)

I have always been intrigued by the gospel passage of today. The man in the gospel ran to Jesus to ask what he could do to inherit eternal life. He desired to be saved but was he ready to do what it would take to be saved? He went to Jesus. He had kept all the commandments from his youth. But from this encounter with Jesus, we learn that to enter heaven we need to do more than keeping the commandments. The commandments are mainly what to avoid, not what to do. We cannot make heaven only by avoiding sin. We make it by doing good.

The man was too attached to his wealth; he was carried away by the good things and pleasures of this life. He was offered a choice between the riches of this world and heaven. He chose worldly riches.

When he said he had kept all the commandments from his youth. Jesus told him, 'Yes, you have done well, but there is still one thing you lack; and that is love, a generous heart.' Jesus told him, "Go, sell what you have, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." But he refused. He walked away from Jesus. He turned his back on eternal life. He was unduly attached to his riches.

Are we like this rich man? Do we keep the commandments but lack love? How often do we reach out in love to the poor, the needy, and the hungry? The faith we have must be practical. Faith and good works (love) are like the two sides of a coin. They must go together. (1Cor 13: 1-13). That was what St James meant when he said that "Faith without works is dead." (James 2: 17-20).

Is it easy to combine faith and good works, of course not. But with God it is possible. We need the grace of God. That is why Jesus said, "This is impossible for man but not for God." We cannot go beyond the standard of the world without God. Remember Jesus' words in John 15: 5 "Cut off from me you can do nothing." To achieve our full human potential, to reach out in love to our brothers and sisters, to inherit eternal life, we need God. Seek God in prayer. Listen to him by reading the bible. As someone said, "If we walk toward God one step, he'll run toward us ten steps." If we take the first step of reaching out in love to the needy arounds us, God will afford us the grace and wherewithal to complete the good work.

I invite us all to make St Ignatius prayer of Generosity our own, "Lord, teach us to be generous. Teach us to serve as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to ask for reward, except to know that we are doing your will." Amen.
