REFLECTION for Twenty-Ninth Sunday (B)

In the gospel passage we see human greed and unholy ambition rear their ugly heads among some of the disciples of Jesus. The two sons of Zebedee asked Jesus to give them the best seats, the closest seats to him in his kingdom: to sit one at his left and the other at the right in his kingdom. They did not care about the other ten. Ambition blinded them. Is it not surprising that having stayed with Jesus for a while, in such physical proximity, the two brothers failed to allow the holiness, goodness, and humility of Jesus rub off on them? Jesus came to raise their hearts and minds heavenward, but they were still attracted by earthly ambition.

Jesus used the opportunity to teach the disciples and all of us a great lesson in love, selflessness, and humility. The two brothers thought that the kingdom of heaven was a place for the highest bidder. They thought one could get there by physical affiliation. They were wrong. Jesus told them that getting into the kingdom of heaven was through love and service (Mt 25:35-40). Love and service are like two sides of a coin. They always go together. You cannot have one without the other.

Jesus gave us an example of this when he said in John 3: 16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son..." It was because of the love that God has for humanity that he sacrificed his only begotten son for the salvation of the world. True love is about giving, not taking – To give, without counting the cost.

Jesus, the son of God came into the world and turned human values upside down. In the world the leader lords it over others, great men and women make their authority felt. Not so with those who belong to the kingdom of heaven. Among those destined for the kingdom of heaven, the great ones are to serve while the first must make themselves last. Just as Jesus came into "the world from heaven not to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt 20:28). Today's gospel holds out a challenge to all of us. As disciples of Jesus, we have to give our lives in loving service for others. We are not in this world to dominate others. We are not in our positions to lord it over anyone. The gospel is an invitation to us to begin imitating Jesus in love and humility, by serving one another, at home, at work, and on our streets.
