# REFLECTION for Thirty-First Sunday (B)

In today's gospel Jesus was asked by a scribe which was the first of all the commandments. Alongside the Ten Commandments, Jews law had over <u>six hundred</u> other laws or regulations. These sometimes confused the teachers of the law. Jesus answered him by quoting two Old Testament passages, Deuteronomy 6: 4-5 and Leviticus 19: 18. By this answer Jesus not only made love of God supreme, but he also attached to it the love of neighbour. Love of God and love of neighbour go hand in hand. They are like the two sides of the same coin. They are inseparable.

One cannot claim to have a loving relationship with God but does not love the neighbour. No. It wont work. St John confirmed this when he said, "If someone says he loves God, but hates his brother, he is a liar. For he cannot love God, whom he has not seen, if he does not love his brother, whom he has seen. The command that Christ has given us is this: whoever loves God must love his brother also." (1Jn 4: 20)

We serve the God we cannot see in our neighbour we can see. Jesus told us this when he said, "I was hungry you gave me food, I was thirsty you gave me something to drink... Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me." (Mt 25: 25-40) Love is not abstract. Love is real. Love is a person in Jesus Christ. We love our neighbour because we love God. And we make our love for God real and concrete when we love our neighbour.

There is less love of neighbour in the world today because there is less love of God. The more humanity distances itself from God, the less love there is in the world.

Why did Jesus say to the scribe, "You are not far from the kingdom of God."? Because he did not reject the answer of Jesus. He agreed that love of God and neighbour was far "more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." But Jesus did not say that the scribe was in the kingdom, he was only near it. He needed only one thing to enter. He needed to follow Jesus; to have Jesus in his life. Only in Jesus can we find the true meaning of love. Because Jesus, God, is love. (1Jn 4: 16)

There are people who talk about love. They talk about loving others and giving money to good causes. They tell you that they do not go to church but that they do good to people. No matter the good they do, until they accept Jesus, the one who is love and who performed the greatest act of love, (Jn 15: 13) into their lives, they cannot fully understand the meaning of true love. If our love for others is not rooted in or does not flow from the love of God, then it is not true love; it is empty.
