REFLECTION Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

In today's gospel passage form John 2: 1-12 we have the story of Jesus at the wedding at Cana, where at the behest of his mother, he performed his first miracle. I invite us to reflect on the joy and grace of having Jesus in your home.

There is the story of this young couple who bought their first house. In the main large sitting room, there was a large conspicuous space on the wall for a painting. The husband wanted a large, framed picture of their wedding, but the wife wanted a picture of the Divine Mercy they got as a gift from their parish priest. They argued over it for a while. The man wanted their wedding picture there because it was the first thing anyone entering the house would see. The same reason the wife wanted the Divine Mercy picture there. Remembering Matthew10: 32, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my Father in heaven", the man gave in. Family and friends who visited them never failed to comment about the striking impact the picture had on them. You feel the love and protection of the Lord in the presence of the picture and you are left with the conviction that Jesus was watching over all in the house.

Brothers and sisters, the presence of Jesus in your home, in your life always makes a difference, a positive difference! The young couple in today's gospel will certainly agree. They invited Jesus into their home, to their wedding, and his presence made all the difference. His presence not only gave them joy, but it also saved them from embarrassment. This was not the only miracle Jesus performed in people's homes. Remember,

In Mark 1: 31, Jesus went to the home of Peter and there, healed his mother-in-law.

In Mark 5: 41, Jesus went to Jairus' house and there, raised the dead daughter to life.

Do you have Jesus in your home? Does the crucifix or the picture or image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary have a prominent place in your home?

When you invite friends or family members to a meal, do you skip prayer before meal so as not to offend them? You wouldn't want to offend your guests, what about God?

Jesus assures us in Revelation 3: 20. "Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter and dine with them, and they with me."

Brothers and sisters, Open the door of your home to Jesus, invite him into your home. He takes nothing good away from you but gives you everything that is noble, wonderful, joyful, and grace filled.

There is this beautiful prayer families frame and hang on their walls. It says, "Christ is the head of this house. The Unseen guest at every meal, and the silent listener to every conversation."

As you bring Jesus into your home, may you and your family feel his love and protection always. Amen.
