

## REFLECTION Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Today, Sunday of the Word of God, in the first reading, Ezra the priest assisted by the Levites read out loud the word of God to the hearing of the people. The word of God had a profound effect on all who heard. In the gospel Jesus entered the Synagogue and read a passage from the prophet Isaiah that talked about himself and his mission.

Our two readings point to the importance of the reading, listening to and meditating on the word of God in the life of a believer. Jesus is the Word of God. He speaks the word, and he is the word spoken. Jn 1: 1 says, 'In the beginning was the word and the word was with God and the word was God.' That is why the Lord said in Isaiah 55: 11, 'The word that proceeds from my mouth shall not return to me empty but must accomplish that which I please.' This word of God 'is spirit and life,' (Jn 6: 63) it is 'living and active. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword' (Heb 4: 12) it 'gives life', (Proverbs 3: 1).

How much value do you place on the Word of God? How often do you read the bible, and meditate on it? The bible, the word of God is the book of life. If you want to hear the voice of God, if you want to have a conversation with God, read the bible daily.

The Jews had two places of worship, the Temple, and the Synagogue. There was only one Temple in Jerusalem while the synagogue was in every village and town, and it was a place for reading and explaining the word Of God. In Luke 2: 22 Jesus was presented in the Temple by Mary and Joseph where they offered the sacrifice prescribed by the Law, Ex 13: 2, Lev 14; 22). In Luke 1: 1ff, as in several other passages, Jesus went to the Synagogue to celebrate the Word; as in today's gospel, he read the word of God and explained it to the people and told them that what they heard was being fulfilled right before them.

In the Holy sacrifice of the Mass, the celebration of the Word of God and the offering of Sacrifice to God are brought togetherthe Liturgy of the Word, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. But the Eucharist is on a far higher and incomparable level. The temple sacrifice was with the blood of animals. The Eucharistic sacrifice is with the blood of Jesus, the Word of God.

In the Holy Mass, the word of God that is read, explained, and meditated upon is then offered to the Father. The beauty and the mystery are that he who is offered is the one offering. Jesus the Word is the one being offered, and he is the one offering. He is both priest and victim. Isn't that marvellous? Imagine the beauty and the wonder!

That is why the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the most wonderful, the most sublime and the greatest prayer and worship we can offer to God. It is a prayer, the only prayer on earth in which Jesus is the one being offered to the Father, and he is still the one offering. The Father cannot see Jesus being offered and offering and not pay heed. That is why the Holy Mass is the greatest anyone can say on earth.
