REFLECTION Fifth Sunday (C)

The three readings today present these three great men of our faith who at the time of their call felt unworthy. Isaiah said 'Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am of unclean lips, and dwell in the midst of people of unclean lips.' Paul said, 'For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God.' Peter said to Jesus, 'Depart from me, For I am a sinful man, Lord.' They were all humble. Humility gives you a sense of unworthiness and nothingness before God. We are all unworthy to come before the presence of God. Let us focus briefly on Peter.

Jesus was preaching by the lake and caught sight of two empty fishing boats. Jesus decided to enter one of them, Simon Peter's. Why did he pick Peter's?

Also, sometimes, disappointments may bring us blessings. Peter and his companions worked hard all night and caught nothing. It was the most disappointing night for them. Little did they know that God was nearby to change their story. If Peter and his companions had caught some fish that night, they would have gone home or to the market to sell their catch and would not have been there when Jesus came.

Sometimes when you have worked so hard without succeeding, do not give up. God may have other plans. With God all things are possible. Our God is a God of possibilities; he can write straight on a crooked line. God can bring out something wonderful from a bad situation. He can bring success out of failure. It was the failure of the night that gave them the huge catch of the morning.

But the morning success came because Peter trusted Jesus. If we must overcome weaknesses and challenges, we must have faith and trust in God. When Jesus told Peter to put out his net for a catch, he answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And we know what followed. The man who worked all night and failed, had the biggest success of his entire fishing career. That was faith at work. Faith can do the unimaginable; it can make the impossible possible.

'What God cannot do does not exist.' If he created the entire universe out of nothing, (Gen 1) if he parted the red sea for the people of Israel to cross, (Ex 14) if he became a human being and died on the cross to save us, (Jn 3: 16) if he raised the dead, (Jn 11: 38) cured the sick, (Mt 8) gave sight to the blind, (Mk 10: 46) made the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak, (Mk 7: 31) if he raised Peter from being a fisherman to a fisher of men, (Lk 5) called him from nothingness to greatness; if he changed his failure to suc

cess, then he can do the same and more for you; you only need to listen to him, and trust his words. Peter said, 'Lord at your word I will let down the net.' Let go and let God. Listen to his word. Believe in the word of God. Trust Jesus. Jesus, I trust in you!

'O that today you will listen to his voice, harden not your hearts.' (Ps 94) God bless you.
