REFLECTION Sixth Sunday (C)

In today's gospel Jesus said, 'Blessed are you poor, for yours is the kingdom of God'. What did he mean by 'you poor'?

By the poor, Jesus was referring to people who whether materially rich or poor, put all their hope and trust in God. Those who know that they could not depend on the material things of this world to gain happiness. So, they are wise enough to seek all their joy and happiness from the Lord. No matter what they have or do not have, God means everything to them. Their joy and consolation come not from the things of this world, but from God.

It is this kind of childlike trust that Jesus wants his followers to have; no matter the challenge. As it is said, 'Work as if everything depended on you, but pray believing that everything depends on God.' Put your trust in the Lord. Our God is a God of possibilities not of probabilities. With him 'all things are possible.' Mt 19: 26. 'Can you by worrying add a moment to your lifespan?' Lk 12: 25. Jesus continued, 'Your Father knows that you need (these things). Instead, seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and these things will be given you also.' (Mt 6: 33)

People today put more trust in the things of the world than they do in God. They put their trust in money, their abilities, science, and technology. God is wiser than all the wisest human beings put together. God is richer than all the richest men and women and all the riches in the world put together. God is stronger than all the military of the world put together. Proverbs 3: 5 says, 'Trust in the Lord with all your heart.' Ps 37: 4 says, 'Trust in him (God) and he will act.' Is 26: 7, 'Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord God is an everlasting rock.' Jn 14: 1, 'Let not your hearts be troubled, trust in the Lord.' Phillip 4: 19, God will supply all your needs according to his riches.
