REFLECTION, EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY (C)

The parable of the rich fool in the gospel of today reminds us that it is foolish to live without reference to God; for, God is the source and origin of all we have and are. Without him we are nothing. Consequently, the true value of our lives does not really consist of our possessions or our accomplishments; rather it consists in living in communion with God and using our possessions to give glory to God.

This means we must always live with a basic awareness of our radical dependence on God, so that even when we have the things of this world abundantly, we are never forgetful of God and our obligation to acknowledge and worship him. Indeed, when we live with an awareness of our dependence on God it helps us to remain humble and accord God his proper place in our life and, so, avoid all forms of idolatry.

A basic challenge here is that we tend to be carried away by the things of this world and become forgetful of God, as we begin to see ourselves more and more as our own master and, so, hardly feel the need to refer anything to him, believing misguidedly, of course, that we are self-sufficient. The case of the rich man in the gospel of today clearly illustrates this challenge.

While there is nothing wrong in celebrating when we are successful, to celebrate without acknowledging God, is tantamount to usurping the glory of God. This folly of inflating our self-importance by usurping the glory of God does not go on perpetually, as something suddenly happens that breaks the cycle of self-absorption and reveals our assumed security to be misplaced. It could be sickness or crisis or misfortune or whatever. But when it happens we come to the realization that we are not our own master, but are radically dependent on God. In the case of the rich man, the moment he settled down to enjoy him-self, God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made of your soul and, this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?"

The situation of the rich man clearly illustrates there is no security in material possession or worldly accomplishments. Indeed, as Jesus says in warning us against avarice of any kind, "a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs". To think otherwise simply amounts to vanity, hence the preacher instructively says that, "vanity of vanities. All is vanity". The truth is that a life that is lived without reference to God is simply empty!

We may think ourselves secure on account of our material possession but experience shows that this is sheer folly. What really gives us security is to live a life that is totally dependent on God and devoted to the service of God and humanity, so that whatever possession we have becomes a means of making a difference in people's life. If we realize that our possessions have been entrusted to us as stewards, as faithful servants of God, we will always be guided by the fear of God in dispensing them, so as to use them in a manner that gives glory to God rather than simply inflating our self-importance. This, is perhaps, why Jesus concluded the parable by declaring in respect of the tragic fate of the rich fool: "So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God."

Lord, give us the grace to realize our radical dependence on you; for, you alone, not our possessions or accomplishments, truly guarantees our security.
