REFLECTION, NINETEENTH SUNDAY (C)

We must keep in mind that this world is not our home. We are pilgrims on earth; we are on a journey towards our heavenly home. As Scripture tells us, our span is seventy years and eighty for those who are strong. While we are here, therefore, we must bear in mind the purpose of our existence, remembering that this life is a preparation for the life to come, so that the manner we live out our lives here has a bearing on our future state. God created us to know him, to love him and to serve, so that at the end of our lives we can be happy with him forever in heaven.

If we are to attain our heavenly destination, it is important to live a life that is pleasing to God. In this context, nothing is as important as putting to maximum use the resources the Lord has given us. We must use our resources to make wise investment for the future – our eternal future. Practically, this means we must live such that our lives make a positive difference in our family, in our community, in our place of work, and indeed, in the life of anyone we come in contact with. We should become a source of blessing to others by using our talents, time and treasure in making a positive difference. This is the best way to prepare for the end that must surely come.

No one knows the hour or the time when the son of man will come. Nonetheless, it is important that he finds us ready whenever he comes, whether it is in the third watch, or the sixth watch or the ninth watch. The proper attitude to adopt, if we are not to be caught napping, is vigilance. Concretely, vigilance implies that we are so attentive to our purpose of being here that we maximize the benefits of each moment by investing wisely in doing good works.

If we make the best of every moment, we need to be afraid of death; for, it will be clear that each moment is a preparation to meet our Lord. We do not need any special preparation than to live as he wants us to live. There could be no better preparation than to live in God and live for God every moment. If we truly live in God and live for God, we will be moved to expend our resources wisely.

If we learn to walk by faith rather than sight, living a full life each moment of our existence will come to us naturally, and there could be no better way to prepare ourselves for our eternal home. The issue of living in the present and making the best of each moment as preparation for heaven is so important that it demands our constant attention. We need to interrogate ourselves periodically, whether we are putting our resources to full use or not. This periodic or continual interrogation of our motivation for living is part and parcel of the dynamics of what it means to be vigilant. It is more or less a sort of self-examination and, if done properly, it will not only help to preserve our focus, it will also have a positive impact on our actual performance in respect of how we utilize our resources. This life is too short to waste our time and resources on matters of marginal importance.

A full consciousness of the contingency of human life should intensify our determination to make the best of every moment and live as if it were our last moment. If we are driven by such passion, there is no doubt that the coming of the son of man will find us ready, whenever that happens, and we would be more than happy retrospectively, that all our sacrifices have not been in vain.
