REFLECTION, TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY (C)

When we are grateful for favours received from God, not only is God pleased with us but we also position ourselves to receive more favours from God. The way to increase our blessings, therefore, is to be thankful for everything. But the problem is that we take God's blessings for granted and fail to show appreciation for his goodness to us. We know how to make requests but we show no appreciation upon receiving what we ask.

Such is the situation in today's gospel in respect of the encounter between Jesus and the ten lepers. In their great need the lepers were quick to invite Jesus into their situation. But only one returned to thank Jesus after they had been cleansed of their leprosy. When he realized he had been healed he turned back and praised God with a loud voice and fell on his face at the feet of Jesus, giving him thanks. The ingratitude of the other nine who did not return to give thanks, prompted Jesus to remark, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" In praising the one who returned to give thanks, Jesus concluded by saying, "Rise and go your way: your faith has made you well."

The ingratitude of the other nine lepers contrasts sharply with Namaan's attitude in the first reading. Like the leper that returned to thank Jesus Namaan did not fail to show appreciation to Prophet Elisha after he had been cured of his leprosy. In fact, moved by a deep sense of appreciation for what Elisha had done for him, he overwhelmed Elisha with gifts, even as Elisha refused to accept the gifts, prompting Namaan to transfer the gifts to Elisha's servant who had played a key role in mediating Namaan's cure by prevailing on him to bathe in the Jordan as Elisha had instructed him.

What is clear is that there is a strong correlation between faith and gratitude. When we approach each situation of life with faith, we will not fail to acknowledge God's goodness to us. Being mindful of God's intervention in our lives will elicit in us sentiments of gratitude and appreciation, meaning that we cannot hold back from praising him or showing our appreciation either by offering him gifts, or by resolving to amend our lives.

If only we can take time to think of God's goodness to us, we will always be filled with a sense of gratitude and appreciation. It is only someone who lacks faith that will fail to perceive the goodness of God in his life. Such lack of faith will mean that we will always be poor for, even when we have been blessed by God, we may not see that he has blessed us but may persist in complaining that we do not have enough. On the contrary, if we are people of faith, even in what seems to be a situation of not having enough we will perceive that God provides for us and, as a result, we thank God for everything.
