

REFLECTION, TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY (C)

The gospel today reminds us of the need to be persistent in prayer, not to lose heart or give up on any matter we commit to God in prayer but wait patiently upon the Lord until our request is granted. This is the basic lesson that the widow in the gospel teaches us. She would not allow herself to be discouraged by the negative attitude of the judge who refused to acknowledge her right. Rather than give up, she persisted in pressing him until her persistence moved the wicked judge to consider and grant her request. Overwhelmed by the force of her persistence, he reasoned to himself that it was better to give the woman what she wanted than allow her to pester him to death.

The exchange between the widow and the judge demonstrates the importance of persistence as a condition for success in anything we do in life. Unless we have the capacity to persist in what we do, we can never succeed in anything we do. This is especially true of prayer. Unless our prayer possesses the quality of persistence it can hardly be effective.

In telling the parable Jesus wanted to commend the persistence of the widow and how it helped her to obtain what she wanted. More importantly, Jesus wanted to establish a contrast between the wicked judge and God our Father in heaven and assure us that with God we will always get a better deal if we persist in prayer.

The judge neither had the fear of God or respect for man, yet he was moved by the woman's persistence. If this is the case, we should expect much better results from God, for God is not only good – and good all the time, but he is also all knowing and all powerful. He knows everything and he can do everything. Moreover, he is also all benevolent, so that all the time he has our best interest at heart.

If we truly understand the nature of God, if we truly understand that he always means the best for us, we will never give up on anything we have committed to him, even when it appears there is apparently no answer to our prayer or when such answer appears to be slow in coming. Our understanding of God should in such circumstances motivate us to persist in seeking what we request and wait patiently upon him until our request is granted. Lord grant us the sort of faith that never gives up until our request is granted.
