REFLECTION, Thirty-Third Sunday (C)

We are reminded today that nothing in this world lasts forever. Whatever has a beginning also has an end. If we live with a basic awareness of the reality of the end time, it is sure to affect how we approach our life and every moment of it. It is sure to motivate us to make the best of our time and resources here on earth by investing them in good works.

However, Jesus warns us in the gospel that the end is real, even if we do not know precisely when this will be or how it will happen. Indeed, Jesus says no one knows of that day or hour, "not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the father." If the end is real and will happen someday, it is foolish not to acknowledge it. It is even dangerous to live without this basic awareness every moment of our lives. For if we do, we will live carelessly without any sense of accountability and this means we could be caught unaware when the end eventually comes.

On the contrary if we keep the end in view and live with a basic awareness of its reality, it will help us comport ourselves well as well as help us to realize that we do not have all the time. This in turn will make us to be focused and make the best of every moment. There is so much good we can accomplish during our life here on earth but, unless we have our priorities well defined, it is not likely to maximize our opportunities in life. If we live with the awareness that we will not be here all the time and no moment will be repeated once it is gone, we will be careful to do all the good we can do while here knowing full well it is investment for eternal life.

The reality of the end time is associated with the second coming of Christ. At his first coming he assumed our human conditioned and suffered a shameful death on the cross so as to make salvation possible for us, so that whosoever believes in him and walks in his footsteps will find eternal life and not perish. The benefit of his first coming offers us the opportunity to accept him as our personal Lord and saviour and live a life that conforms to the pattern of his life, as it is only by following him that we can hope to be saved.

Unlike the first coming, the second coming is a time of reckoning, a time when he comes in his glory to ask us how we have lived our lives. This is clear from the scene of the last judgment reported in the Bible where the just are rewarded and welcomed into the kingdom of God while the wicked are condemned to punishment in hell fire. The thought that we are going to render an account of our stewardship at the end of our lives is one that understandably fills us with dread for, in truth, if the Lord should mark our guilt no one will survive. The fact that we do not know precisely at what hour the master will return makes it likely that we may be found unprepared when he comes.

We need to ask ourselves how serious we take our faith and how much commitment we give to our prayer life? If we live according to the demands of our faith, there is no need for us to be afraid of meeting the Lord whenever he comes. Let us pray for the grace therefore to cherish our faith and put it to maximum use in making the best of each moment, so that when the son of man comes he will truly find us ready and reward us with the crown of glory.
