

REFLECTION, First Sunday of Advent (A)

. Advent is a time to prepare for the coming of the son of man. We prepare to welcome Christ into our domain. We prepare for his twofold coming – his coming at Christmas and his coming at the end of time. In preparing for his coming we allow him to prepare us by himself. We invite him to come into our hearts afresh and remove the rubbish in our lives. We invite him to come and cleanse us, so that set free from what makes us unworthy of him we are ready to welcome him with joy and enthusiasm.

Nothing could be greater than meeting the Lord; for, such encounter is always rewarding and deeply transforming as we are never the same thereafter. But to profit from our encounter with the Lord it is important that our hearts are clean, ready to welcome him. Our hearts must be totally centred on God. We cannot prepare adequately unless we become aware of God's presence in our lives and deliberately yield ourselves to his control. The consequence of becoming aware of his presence and responding appropriately is that we become more and more attentive to the manner of lives we are living, especially, whether our priorities are right and whether our lives are pleasing to God and why our lives are pleasing to God or not.

If we truly open to the presence of God and so become aware of our true situation, we become aware of the influence and the hold of the false self upon us. We become aware of our double life and how it makes it difficult for us to experience the joy and peace of God's kingdom. As we become aware of our failings and the correlation between sinfulness and lack of true satisfaction in our lives, we are motivated to work hard to overcome the influence of the false self on us and allow the true self to assert itself. With the emergence of the true self, we become more and more clear about our priorities as we also find the inner strength and courage to pursue them, even if it means others may not approve of us, so that in a sense we become a sign of contradiction to the world, so far as we live in the world but are not of the world.

The emergence of the true self is always the result of prayer and personal friendship with Christ, in which Christ himself undertakes to reform us through the power and influence of the Holy Spirit. Indeed, the more we dwell in the presence of Christ the more we assume his attitudes and dispositions so that we now see things increasingly as he would see them, just as his desires and taste also become our desires and taste. In the presence of Christ and as a result of the influence of the Holy Spirit upon us our many loves dissolve into one love – the divine love the source of all we have and are. The result is that our lives become more and more integrated.

Consequently, set free from the hold of the false self on us, we come to reflect more and more the image of Christ and enjoy the freedom of the children of God, the freedom that enables us to do the will of God and reject evil in all its ramifications. What is clear, therefore, is that the journey of Advent involves a basic invitation to turn our hearts and lives to God and allow him to reshape us in the image of Christ. If we approach the coming weeks in this fashion and submit ourselves to the discipline of Advent, it means we would emerge with a new heart and a renewed spirit at the end of the exercise, ready to celebrate Christmas worthily and meet the Lord at the end of time. There is no better way to adequately prepare for the incarnation event than by opening our lives to God and removing everything in us that is not of God. As we start the journey of Advent today, let us resolve to be generous in responding to the invitation to open ourselves completely to God.
