

REFLECTION, Second Sunday of Advent (A)

As we enter the second week of our preparation for the coming of the Lord at Christmas and at the end of time, the gospel confronts us with the figure of St John the Baptist. As the precursor of Christ, the vocation of John was to prepare the people for the coming of Christ. John took this assignment seriously and devoted all his energy to it. He lived a humble and simple life and preached a baptism of repentance, calling the people to turn away from their sins and make their hearts ready for the coming of the messiah.

John understood that as the precursor of Christ his vocation was to lead others to Christ and not to compete with Christ. As a sign post, his task was to make way for Christ and not draw attention or bind others to himself. Thus, when asked if he was the messiah, John simply answered he was not but that the messiah comes after him and he was not fit to undo the straps of his sandal. So, John is content to remain in the background so long as he succeeded in clearing the way for the messiah. Moreover, in preparing the way for Christ, John taught by example. The message he preached harmonized with his lifestyle such that his life was an inspiration to the people in responding to the call to repentance. John's self-effacement and asceticism all speak of his characteristic humility and simplicity.

As we prepare for the coming of Christ in our contemporary context, the voice of John remains persistent in the wilderness of our lives and we must listen to it attentively. Indeed, we can learn a lot of lessons from John's life and ministry. First is the need to open our hearts to God by removing anything in our lives that is not of God. In this context, the message of repentance John preached remains ever relevant.

Our preparation cannot be said to be adequate unless our hearts are free from sin. We cannot be said to be ready for the coming of the messiah unless we are at peace with God and with one another. If there are those who have hurt us, we must release forgiveness to them and also accept forgiveness from those we have hurt. If our hearts are clean and free from sin the messiah will find us ready and make his home in us.

In view of this, we cannot over-emphasize the importance of going to confession during the period of Advent, since it not only affords us the opportunity to experience God's forgiveness and renewal in our lives but it also empowers us with divine grace to avoid all occasions of sin and, so, live a pure and blameless life. Indeed, if our hearts are pure and we make effort to live a blameless life we will look forward to the coming of Christ with great joy and expectation.

It is important we have enough space in us to receive Christ when he comes. If we are full of ourselves or we are filled up with things that are not of God, there will be no space in us to welcome Christ when he comes. We need to empty ourselves of things that are not of God. Wholly emptied of self and our wayward attachments there will be no limit to which God can fill us with his presence.
